A Survivor's Story

Survivor Marian bravely shared her incredible story of her experience with domestic violence, as well as the critical care provided to her by My Sister's Place in helping lift her up to a better and safer life. Here are some excerpts from Marian's story:

"In trying to move away from the abuse I endured at the hands of my husband, I started to date another man who really changed my life for the worst. He abused me, but worse than I could have ever imagined. He physically, mentally, and sexually abused me for as long as I can remember."

"To me, my life had no meaning. I began using drugs and I really took a turn for the worse. I was addicted to drugs for a little over 30 years. I started drinking, and drinking lead me to crack/cocaine. I was selling my body for drugs and for money. It was a demeaning life. A life I would never want to live again. "

"Coming to My Sister's Place and RISE really brought hope back into my life. They said they wanted to help me and that is exactly what they did. They went above and beyond. I am not broken anymore. I am stronger than ever before. I am literally just learning how to smile because I had so much pain in my life, some from the bad choices I have made and some because of other people. Because of RISE, I am now in an apartment that I love so much. "
